Your application packet must include the following items and all **items must be typed** in Times New Roman 12pt. Font and double-spaced:

Data Sheet form is available online

Professional Resume – typed and no longer than two pages

1. List with brief descriptions how you are active in your Local and school community.
2. Provide three letters of recommendation: Each letter should be typed on letterhead, signed and no more than two pages; totaling six pages of recommendations:

- a. One by a supervisor,
- b. One by a peer, and
- c. One letter by a person of your choice.

3. You should include a typed one-page description of how professional development opportunities have helped to advance your career and how you would like to impact the profession as an educational leader using special skills.

4. In an essay of no more than two typed pages explain how you will use the scholarship award to impact your school community, professionalism or classroom.
